WOW PROJECT GOALS

- 1 To increase the accessibility of water sports reducing barriers that limit the possibilities of social inclusion, the promotion of equal opportunities and the "sport for all" approach principle
- 2 To strengthen volunteers skills in organization and management of activities and events of water sport associations by improving their role as professional providers of personal services to local communities
- 3 To remove cultural barriers in young people and adults, especially among families, teachers and school administrators, that limit water sports practice thanks to the transfer of technical, environmental and cultural knowledge
- 4 To reduce the early dropout phenomenon in water sports through new innovative methods of teaching, couching and educating to "sport for all" values
- 5 To enhance the perception of water sports role in young people education through new forms of collaboration between the different actors of civil society



























Established in 1994, the Natural Park of Monte San Bartolo occupies about 1600 hectares in the province of Pesaro Urbino, extending along the area of the Municipalities of Pesaro and Gabicce Mare.

The park is financed by the Marche Region by a yearly grant of 250.000 € and its activities are certified according to the European Charter for Sustainable Tourism criteria.




























The objectives of the Ente Parco San Bartolo, as stated in Article 1 of Regional Law n.14 of 14/07/2004, concern: the conservation of animals and plants present in the Park territory, the application of management methods or environmental restoration suitable to achieve integration between human kind activities and the natural environment, the promotion of education, training and scientific research, including interdisciplinary activities, as well as compatible recreational activities, the defense and reconstitution of the hydraulic and hydrogeological balances, the promotion of living and working conditions of local populations.















The Natural Park of Monte San Bartolo has its own Park Master Plan, which has been approved and published in the Official Journal of Marche Region n. 104 of 12/12/2011 and which represents a fundamental tool for achieving the Park purposes.

In particular, pursuant to art. 12 of L.394 / 91, as amended by Law 426/98 and in consistency with the art.15 of the R.L. 15/94 modified by R.L. n. 14/2004, the park authority is committed:

- 1) to the protection of naturalistic, landscape and environmental values;
- 2) to the realization of a balanced relationship between economic activities and ecosystem.

























The European Charter for Sustainable Tourism

The San Bartolo Park has joined the CETS and has completed the first phase of the path for the definition of its Strategy and the 5-year Action Plan, together with the local community.

The European Charter for Sustainable Tourism in Protected Areas (CETS) is a methodological tool and a certification that allows better management of protected areas for the development of sustainable tourism.

The crucial element of the Charter is the creation of a collaboration between all the stakeholders involved in developing a common strategy and an action plan for tourism development, based on an in-depth analysis of the local situation. The objective is the protection of the natural and cultural heritage and the continuous improvement of the management of tourism in the protected area in favor of the environment, the local population, businesses and visitors.

The Permanent Forum is the place where the community meets and compares to achieve a vision, as much as possible shared, of a sustainable future for its territory. The realization of a truly shared path is an essential element for the implementation of the CETS principles.











Within the framework of Wave on Wave Erasmus+ project, the San Bartolo Natural park, as member of Local Interest Committee, in collaboration with the Municipality of Pesaro developed many initiatives mainly aimed at removing cultural barriers in young people and adults that limited water sports practice, by organizing social and cultural activities for families and children, favoring the transfer of technical, environmental and cultural knowledge.















These initiatives consist in a series of outdoor laboratories and activities that can be summarized as follow:

Educational workshop # 11 "Flora and Coastal Fauna (August 4 2017)

Title: Discovering life and coastal environment between beach and the waves.

Workshop for children (6 to 12 years). A look at the crustaceans, mollusks and fishes. An opportunity to learn to discover and recognize underwater flora and fauna.

Attendance: 35 children































Educational workshop # 12: "The dangers of the sea" Dangerous animals, invasions and "aliens" ... in our sea! Jellyfishes, spider fishes, anemones ... A workshop to discover dangerous animals living in Adriatic sea: how to behave towards them.
